REPORTING INSTRUCTIONS FOR DRUG COURT APPLICANTS (Pre-Sentence Investigation & Assessment Referral)

The Judge of the Ross County Court of Common Pleas has asked for more information about you, your case(s), your background and your individual risk/needs. The reason for this request is to further assist in making a fair decision about sentencing, classification and/or possible acceptance into the Ross County Drug Court program. Please help the Court and yourself by reporting to the following agencies listed below for a completion of a Pre-Sentence Investigation Interview and an Individualized Assessment. It is in your best interest to approach these interviews by being as truthful and accurate as possible. It is YOUR responsibility to make contact with Ross County Probation Department within 48 hrs of your Court referral to make an appointment. *(See below for contact info)*

Below is a list of documents which you should provide to assist the investigators/assessors in verifying your background. *(Usually you can only provide these if you are not in custody).*

- Birth / Immigration or Naturalization papers
- High School Diploma, GED Certificate or Vocational Certificates
- Proof of residence *(rent receipts, property and mortgage papers, etc.)*
- Military Records or DD214
- Social Security Card
- Drivers License / State I.D.
- Employment Verification *(most recent pay stubs, tax reports, W-2's or other verification)*
- Government Assistance / Benefits (i.e.: food stamps, SSD, unemployment, child support; etc.)
- List of Current Medications Prescribed
